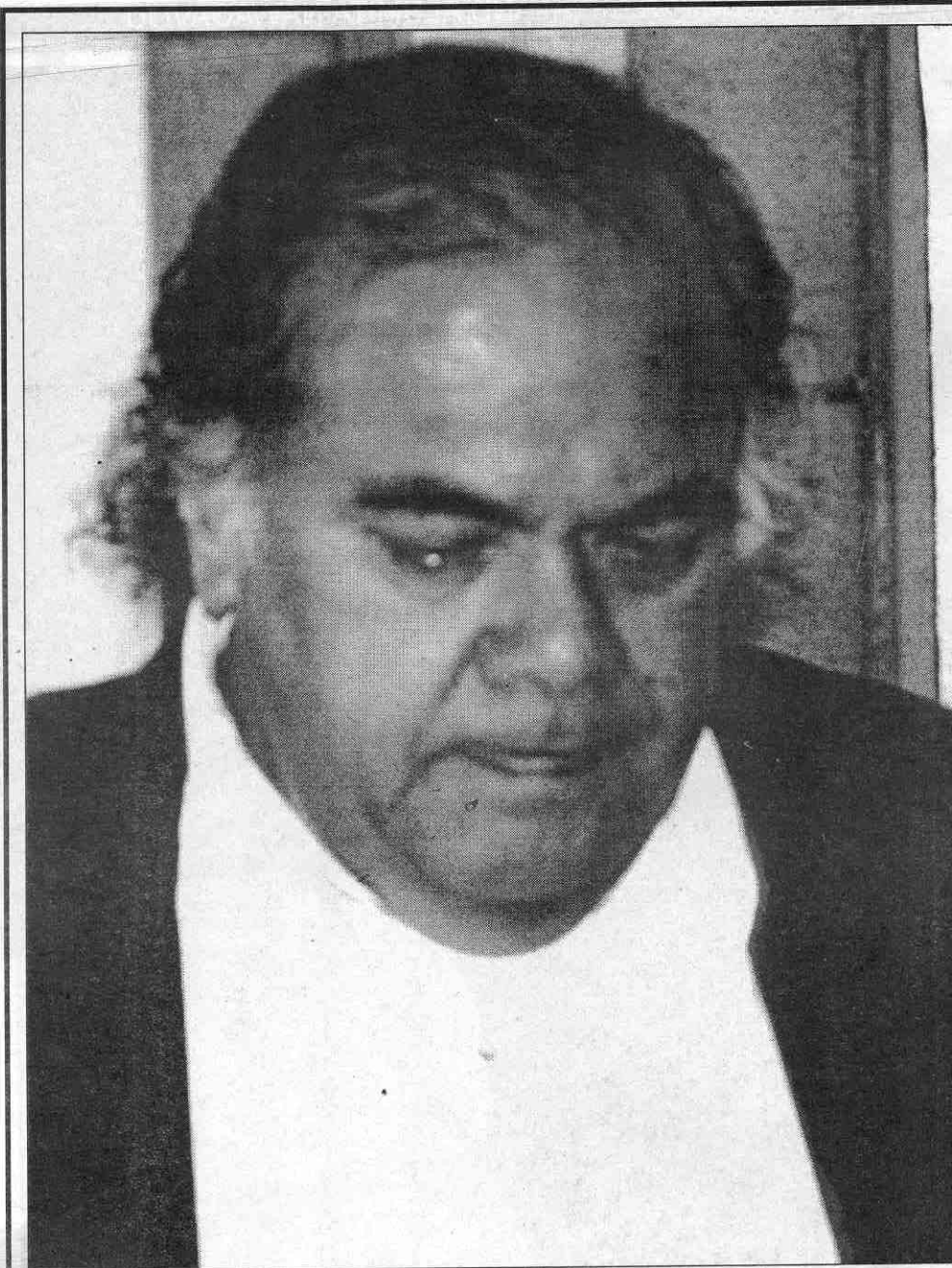
Their staff managed to collect eight boxes of clothing and groceries and school books for the children.

SDL case decision today

THE lawyer representing the Soqosoqo Duavata ni Lewenivanua party lawyer will await a decision today after lodging a writ to Chief Justice Anthony Gates against the Interim Prime Minister and military Commander Frank Bainimarama.

Tevita Fa said he has not been notified on the matter and is awaiting a decision from Justice Gates.

"Anything happens, will happen tomorrow morning," he said.

It is understood that the writ is seeking 11 declarations asking the court to declare the December 5 removal of the democratically elected government as unconstitutional, illegal and void.

The SDL-led multiparty government was overthrown by the military as part of its clean-up campaign to rid the country of alleged corruption.
